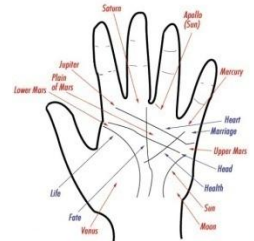

Sponsoring

- Certain groups will ask for donations from businesses/people
- Sponsors must be able to pay a within a time limit
- Sponsors will sponsor runners for every lap they run.
- Sponsors must give us: Name, Last Name, Address, Cell/Home # (If possible), # of runners they will sponsor, amount of donations per lap, max amount of money they will be able to donate and name of the sponsor/number of the runner.

Example : Name of Sponsor: Bob

Last Name of Sponsor: Squarepants

Address: 1800 Sesame Street

Home/Cell #: 416 696 6969

Donation per Lap: \$1 per lap

Max Amount of Money able to donate

The name of the runner they will sponsor/the number of the runner they want to sponsor: Kevin/Runner #10

- Example of payment: Kevin runs 5 laps, Bob sponsors \$1 per lap, Kevin makes 5 dollars

Cost Benefit Analysis



Our costs: There really wasn't any costs except the time, we would be using products the school already has that can be used to fundraise. But there is one variable is that if we stay very late, a janitor might need to clean up after us if we create any messes, but we have split up the tournament into several days so it wont last very long.

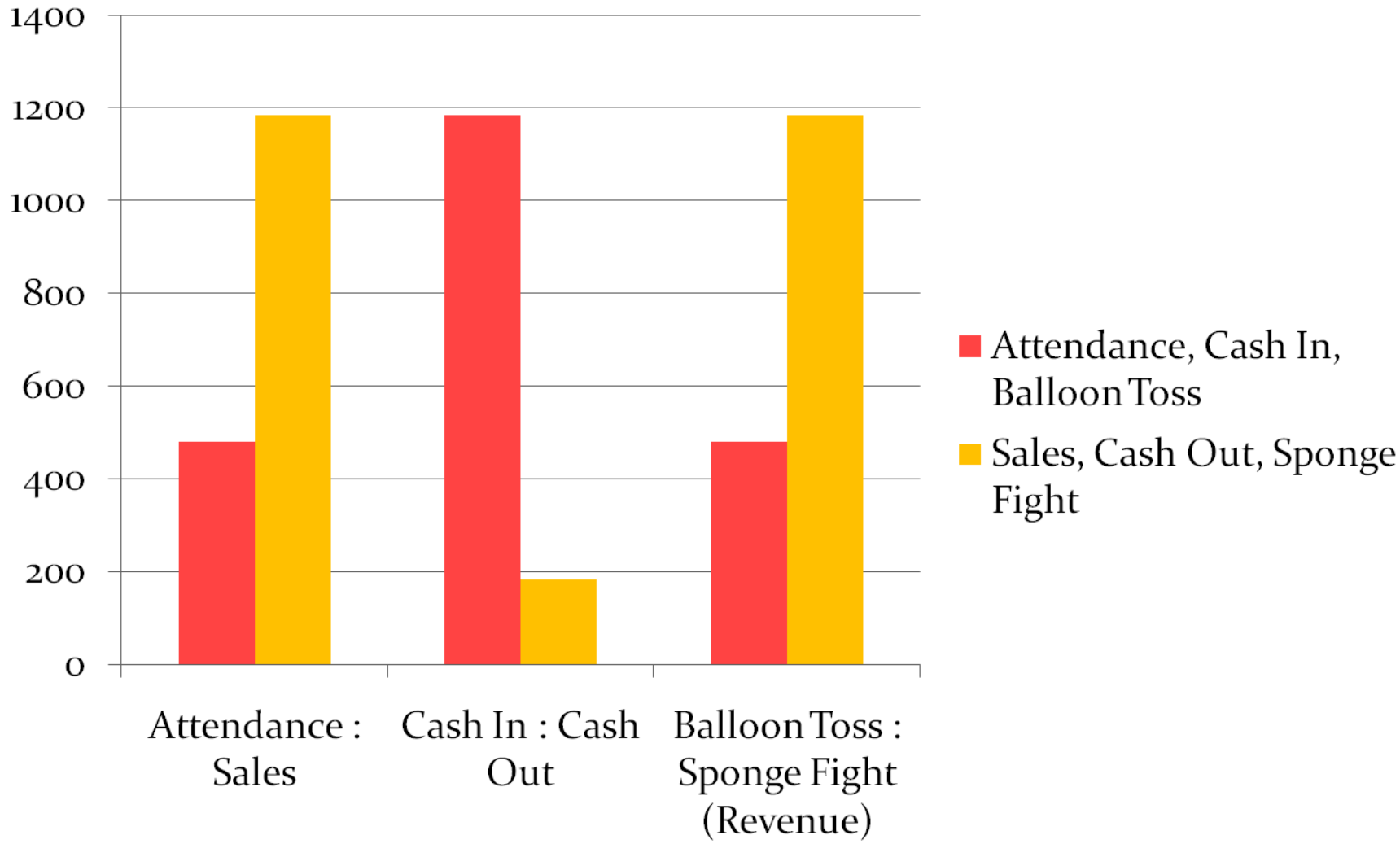

Terminology

- Fundraiser - An event that raises needed resources for a good cause.
- Spread Sheet - A work sheet that shows the management of money
- Cash In - Money that is gained
- Cash Out – Money that is used
- Cash Flow – The exchange of money
- Cumulative Cash Flow – The amount of money generated over time that is a free to use
- Donation – Money that is given to help a cause
- Purchases – The items you bought
- Profit – The money you earn when you subtract cash in from the cash out
- Sales – When money is gained in exchange for product or service
- Expenses – Cost or charge
- Administration Cost – The money used to run the event
- Predictions – Something that theoretically would happen based on current information
- Financial Literacy – The education in the areas of Finance such as management
- Estimation – The predicted result based on current information
- Cost – Amount of money needed to run the event
- Cost Analysis – Determining the amount of money needed to run an event and where the flow of money is going
- Percentage – The amount of a resource or stock given out as and number over 100 (denominator)
- Allocation of Funds – The flow of funding for certain needs
- Labour – The term used for when people work

- We learned from this challenge that it takes a lot of effort to plan an event. We had to go through all the details of the event. From this we will plan out our events from now on.
- We learned how to manage money flow through a spread sheet.
